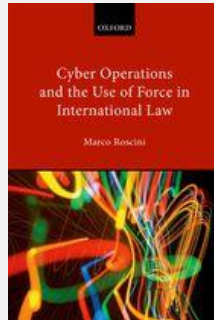


CYBERWARFARE UNDER INTERNATIONAL LAW

With the range and sophistication of cyber-attacks against states showing a dramatic increase in recent times, this book investigates the traditional concepts of 'use of force', 'armed attack', and 'armed conflict' and asks whether existing laws created for analogue technologies can be applied to new digital developments.
