COURSE DESCRIPTION

Global health cooperation has been essential since the 19th century, particularly in combating epidemics. Recent crises like Ebola (2014) and COVID-19 have reinforced the need for international coordination.

Beyond pandemics, global efforts address broader health challenges under Agenda 2030 (SDG 3), including maternal and child health, non-communicable diseases, substance abuse, pollution, climate change, and access to essential healthcare.

Global health law plays a crucial role in shaping these efforts. This course offers an advanced overview of the field, covering key legal principles, actors, existing norms, and ongoing negotiations - with a focus on the WHO pandemic instrument.

Through lectures, seminars, case studies, and field visits (including the WHO), students will engage with experts and practitioners working on global health challenges.
