COURSE DESCRIPTION

This one-week summer school explores how Indigenous Peoples' rights underpin sustainable development, environmental stewardship, and inclusive leadership.

Grounded in human rights frameworks and the UN 2030 Agenda, the course engages Indigenous perspectives, knowledge systems, and ethical approaches to sustainability.

Through interactive sessions and exchanges with Indigenous representatives, experts, and Geneva-based international organizations, participants gain practical insights to integrate Indigenous perspectives into sustainability initiatives responsibly.
