Jacques de Werra is vice-rector of the University of Geneva (where he is in charge – among different projects - of the University's digital strategy <a href="www.unige.ch/digital">www.unige.ch/digital</a>) and professor of law (intellectual property and contract law). He holds a doctorate in law from the University of Lausanne and a Master's degree in Law (LLM) from Columbia Law School and was admitted to the bar in both Geneva and New York. Prof. de Werra was a Faculty Fellow / Faculty Associate at the Berkman Klein Center for Internet and Society (Harvard University) and has held visiting professor positions at various universities, including Stanford Law School, Nagoya University and City University of Hong Kong. He has launched a summer school on Internet law at the University of Geneva (<a href="www.internetlaw-geneva.ch">www.internetlaw-geneva.ch</a>) and co-leads the WIPO – University of Geneva summer school on intellectual property.
